SEMESTER 1 IS ALMOST OVER!

With fewer mandatory Provincial Exams now, there is no need for an EXAM WEEK of no classes. All students will attend all regular blocks leading up to the end of Semester 1. The exceptions to this are those students who still have a Provincial Exam to write. There are also NEW assessments for Numeracy that we are piloting. A schedule of exams is posted around the school and will be emailed home. Teachers with students who are still writing a Provincial Exam are preparing the students now. They know the schedule. Here is what the last week of Semester 1 will look like:

- Monday, Jan 22nd: Regular classes for all grades
- Tuesday, Jan 23rd: Regular classes for all grades
- Wed, Jan 24th: Regular classes for all grades except it is a 1:15 pm early dismissal
- Thurs, Jan 25th: Completion Day - all teachers available for all students who need to catch-up!
- Friday, Jan 26th: Turnaround Day – no students at school except Grade 12s writing exams.
- Monday, Jan 29th: First day of Semester 2
- Grade 8 classes are year-long, not semester, but they follow the same schedule and calendar.

SEMESTER 2 TIMETABLES

We will be handing out NEW Semester 2 timetables for students on Wednesday, January 24th. While many students will have a similar 2nd Semester to the timetable you saw in September, there will likely be a few changes to many timetables.

CAREER CENTRE

NUMERACY ASSESSMENT

Parents/Guardians of Grade 10 and 11 students:

As per the new Ministry of Education graduation requirements, students currently in grades 10 and 11 need to write the new Graduation Numeracy Assessment. All grade 10s and 11s currently in a math class this semester will be writing this the week of January 22-26. Students have been informed of the date and time they will write the assessment. Students in a math class next semester will be writing in late June.

Results will be reported as a four-point proficiency scale on a student's transcript, not as a percentage or blended with a school class mark. Students can re-write the assessment up to two times if they wish to improve their results. GRADE 12 GRADUATION ASSESSMENT

Graduation Assessments will occur the week of January 22 to January 26, 2018. Here are the dates and times of the grade 12 provincial exams:

- Thursday Jan 25 at 9 am: English 12
- Friday Jan 26 at 9 am: Communications 12
- Friday Jan 26 at 12:45: Francais Langue 12

As per the Ministry of Education graduation requirements, students currently in English 12, Communications 12 and/or Francais Langue 12 must write the corresponding provincial exam worth 40% of their final grade.

GRAD TRANSITIONS

All Grade 12 students have now received their Grad Transition package (if you haven't, please pick one up from the Career Center). Graduation Transitions is a 4-Credit requirement that **must** be completed in order for a student to graduate. No mark is assigned. Students will receive an RM (requirements met) upon completion. For more information contact an administrator, the Counseling Department, or the Career Center. You can also check out the Ministry of Education website: [Grad Requirements](#).

All BC secondary school students must complete Graduation Transitions. Graduation Transitions are intended to prepare students for a successful transition to life after secondary school. In order to meet this goal, Graduation Transitions encourages students to:

- Take ownership of their own health and learning
- Examine and demonstrate connections between their learning and their future
- Create a plan for their growth and development as skilled, healthy, knowledgeable, participating citizens
- Exhibit attributes of a model B.C. graduate

All BC secondary school students must demonstrate they have met the following requirements for:

- Personal Health - maintain a personal health plan and participate in at least 150 minutes per week of moderate to vigorous physical activity.
- Community Connections - participate in at least 30 hours of work experience and/or community service and describe what was learned.
- Career and Life - complete a transition plan and present significant accomplishments.

Another aspect consists of students having a Grad Transition Conversation with a guest of their choice, usually a teacher or administrator here at the school.

Grad Transition Interviews: January 19th is your date to complete your Grad Transition interview if your last name begins with **A, B, L, M**. Book now in the Careers Center.

Each grade 12 student has a "**Blue**" sheet they need to complete and bring to their conversation, as well as instructions for setting up their portfolio in [myblueprint.ca](#) - they can see Mrs. Leech in the Careers Center if they need another copy.

WEATHER RELATED CLOSURES

As the temperatures begin to fall, the possibility of snow and icy road conditions becomes an increasing possibility. This is just a reminder that in keeping with SD 79 Policy, the closure of schools and/or the suspension of school bus service for weather related reasons will be made by the Superintendent of School in consultation with the Board.

The decision to close schools and/or suspend school bus service is determined by 6:00 am. The Superintendent will contact radio and TV stations to inform the station as to whether schools will be closed and/or due to impassable or dangerous road conditions, school buses will not run.

Parents may tune in to any of the following radio stations to confirm whether schools are open and school buses are running. Radio Station **JUICE-FM 89.7 Duncan, CBC FM (90.5), CFAX AM (1070) and VI-TV** will be notified by 6:00 am. Parents may also check the **School District website** www.sd79.bc.ca for updates.

During inclement weather conditions, parents are advised to exercise their own judgment in determining if their children should remain at home when travel to school presents a potential safety hazard.

POWER OUTAGES

In case of power outage during school hours, after 15 minutes, the Principal, will contact the school board office to inform them of the outage. Usually the power outage is solved in 2 hours or less. Once the problem is known, the principal will be advised of the time frame.

The Superintendent at the Board Office will decide if students are sent home early or if parents/guardians are to be advised to come and pick up their children. Students are not sent home from school unless authorized by the Superintendent.
