COWICHAN SECONDARY MEMORIAL FOR 215 STOLEN LIVES

In their own act of recognizing and learning the truth on their reconciliation journey, the Environmental Stewardship class at Cowichan Secondary School installed 215 orange ribbons along the fence at the school. The memorial is a poignant reminder to all of the 215 stolen Indigenous lives. Interspersed among the ribbons are messages to the community and to the children who lost their lives.

The students stated it was an act of learning the truth of what happened at Residential Schools across Canada and hoped that the memory of these students would lead their generation to fully embrace reconciliation.

As one Indigenous student said, "Yesterday we honored the 215 children from Kamloops residential school. Not only, but we honoured the fallen. We honoured the survivors. As an indigenous person, we indigenous people are in mourning for the children that didn't make it home. I can't imagine what the survivors went through."

The memorial will remain as a reminder of the work we have to do.

COWICHAN SECONDARY EXCELENCE "C" AWARDS (SEE CRITERIA SLIDE)

At the end of each year, Cowichan Secondary recognizes students who strive for excellence in the areas of scholastics, service, fine arts, and athletics. In the past, each category was identified through teacher nomination. Due to Covid, we do not have the information we need for Athletics and Arts and are looking to you to nominate yourself. We also will tweak the categories slightly to honour outside of school participation due to school activities not being able to continue. Ex. For athletics, if you participated on at least two community teams in 20/21 or if you met the school- based criteria in the previous school year (19/20), then you have met that category standard.

MAJOR SCHOOL AWARDS

STUDENT ACCOMPLISHMENT IS RECOGNIZED AT THE END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR FOR GRADES 10-12. RECOGNITION IS GIVEN TO THOSE WHO STRIVE FOR EXCELLENCE IN THE AREAS OF SCHOLASTICS, SERVICE, FINE ARTS AND ATHLETICS, IN THE FORM OF CERTIFICATES AND SILVER AND GOLD "C" PINS.


Category Criteria For "C" Awards

- SCHOLASTICS- Presented to students who maintain a high level of achievement, Honours with Distinction (GPA 3.8)
- SERVICE- Presented to students who, through voluntary service in the school, make a significant contribution to improving the school and enriching the school life of fellow students. All teachers, coaches and administrators will be asked to submit a list of students' names which will be weighted according to the time and effort spent. Service with Distinction qualifies a student for a "C" as defined below.
- **ATHLETICS** Presented to students who have participated on at least two major extra-curricular teams in one year or have been a member of a team, which qualified for the Provincial Championships.
- FINE ARTS- Presented to fine arts students in good standing who have excelled in a significant extra-curricular manner in the fine arts areas while representing the school and who have been nominated by their teachers (e.g. Film & Music Festivals, Art Exhibitions, National Contest Winners etc.)
- SILVER "C" AWARD- Presented to students in good standing who in a school year excel in at least two of the areas of scholastics (Honours with Distinction), service (with Distinction as nominated by staff), fine arts, or athletics.
- GOLD "C" AWARD- Presented to students in good standing who in a school year excel in at least three of the areas of scholastics (Honours with Distinction), service (with distinction as nominated by staff), fine arts, and athletics.
- PLATINUM "C" AWARD- Highest award given for excellence in all areas: service, fine arts, athletics, and Honours with distinction.
